WHEREAS, neither Medicare nor most private health insurance covers the long term services and support most people with dementia need; and

WHEREAS, the City of Dunwoody recognizes individuals, families, friends and caregivers dealing with the devastating effects of Alzheimer's disease, the researchers who are seeking a cause or causes and cure, and the educational programs and support services provided by the various organizations committed to this cause.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mike Davis, Mayor of the City of Dunwoody, Georgia do hereby proclaim November 2013, as **"ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AWARENESS MONTH"** in the City of Dunwoody.
