Subject: Discussion to Exercise Option Year for Municipal Service

Providers

ITEM DESCRIPTION

To exercise the City's option to retain municipal services providers for the fourth year of the contracts.

BACKGROUND

The City initiated the RFP process in March, 2011 for governmental services to be provided to the City starting in January, 2012. We received 31 proposals from 20 firms. The 2011 Requests for Proposals (RFP) for Governmental Services strategically expanded the number of proposals solicited by breaking out Information Technology, Public Relations and Marketing and Parks and Recreation as individual service areas. Previously, those services were combined with other categories. The City encouraged firms to provide discounted pricing for services if multiple service areas were awarded to a single firm.

The contract terms called for a set pricing for up to four years. The fourth year's term was an optional term at the City's discretion to be approved by Council. Each contractor has performed at a satisfactory level. The pricing on the contracts for the current fiscal year and optional year are as follows:

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Staff recommends the Council exercise the City's option to renew the municipal service provider contracts for all five vendors.
