

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, in 2016, an estimated 53,070 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States and 41,780 will die from the disease; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, is currently the third leading cause of cancer death in the United States, and is projected to become the second leading cause of death by 2020; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is the only major cancer with a fiveyear relative survival rate in the single digits, at just 8 percent; and

WHEREAS, when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is generally in later stages, and 71 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis, while 92 percent of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first five years; and

WHEREAS, approximately 1,090 pancreatic deaths will occur in Georgia in 2016; and

WHEREAS, pancreatic cancer is the seventh most common cause of cancer-related death in men and women across the world; and

WHEREAS, there were an estimated 367,000 new pancreatic cancer cases diagnosed in 2015; and

WHEREAS, the good health and well-being of the residents of the City of Dunwoody, Georgia are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about pancreatic cancer and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments.

NOW, **THEREFORE I**, Denis L. Shortal, Mayor of the City of Dunwoody, Georgia, do hereby proclaim **November 17, 2016** as **World Pancreatic Cancer Day** in the City of Dunwoody, Georgia.
