2. Discussion on percentage for public art.

FROM CITY OF DUNWOODY ORDINANCE 2020-XX-XX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DUNWOODY CREATING PROCEDURES FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF PUBLIC ART INSTALLATIONS AND IMPLEMENTATION OF PUBLIC ART PROGRAM

Chapter 29. Public Art.

Sec. 29-1. Definitions.

- (a) "Public Art" shall be defined as a work created by an artist as defined herein, as approved by the Public Art Commission created herein, for display in public space or visible from a public space.
- (b) Public Art shall include the following:
 - (1) All forms of limited edition or one-of-a-kind original creations of visual art, both decorative and utilitarian, including but not limited to paintings, drawings, photographs, collages, ceramics, artistic glass, stained glass, and fiber art
 - (2) Functional features or enhancements, such as benches and fountains, that are unique to the location
 - (3) Murals, frescos or mosaics covering walls
 - (4) Sculptures, including statues, reliefs and mobiles, which can be free-standing, wall-supported and/or suspended and made of durable materials suitable to the site and the climate; and
 - (5) Technological media that may develop through artistic pursuit or adaptation of digital, audio, video or graphic media; use of lighting, the internet, and the like;
 - (6) Other suitable artworks as presented to, and approved by, the sole decision of the Public Art Commission.
- (c) Public Art shall not include:
 - (1) Elements incorporated for the primary purpose of advertising a business, product or service, including but not limited to logos, trademarked symbols, colors, images of commercial products, texts or numbers;
 - (2) Directional elements such as super-graphics, signage or color coding except where these elements are integral parts of the original works of art;
 - (3) Mass-produced objects, such as fountains, statutory objects or playground equipment;
 - (4) Reproduction by mechanical or other means of original works of art;
 - (5) Decorative ornamental or functional elements created by the project architect or landscape architect instead of an artist commissioned for this purpose;
 - (6) Electrical, water or mechanical service for activation of the works of art;
 - (7) Art exhibitions and educational activities;
 - (8) Security and publicity concerning the works of art; and
 - (9) Art used as signage.
- (d) "Artist" shall be defined as an individual, or a group of people, who meets one or more of the following criteria:
 - (1) realizes income through the sale, performance, publication or commission of original works of art (2) has previously exhibited, presented, performed or published original works of art in museums, galleries or other recognized art venues and publications
 - (3) has formal training or education in a field of art; and
 - (4) has received awards or other forms of recognition from arts juries, arts grant panels, and similar entities for his/her/their artistic abilities or accomplishments.

Act of 1990, 17 U.S.C. §§106A and 113(d) ("VARA") and any other local, state, foreign or international law, as currently drafted or as may be hereafter amended, that conveys the same or similar rights ("Moral Rights Laws"), with respect to the Work, its display, removal from display, exhibition, installation, conservation, storage, study, alteration and any other activities conducted by the City, its officers, employees, agents, contractors, licensees, successors or assigns. If the Work is incorporated into a building such that the Work cannot be removed from the building without physical defacement,

mutilation, alternation, distortion, destruction, or other modification (collectively, "Modification") of the Work, artist waives any and all such claims under any Moral Rights Laws arising out of or against any current or future owners of the site, and its agents, officers and employees, for Modification of the Work.

The City has the absolute right to change, modify, destroy, remove, relocate, move, replace, transport, repair or restore the Work, in whole or in part, in City's sole discretion.

The City has no obligation to pursue claims against third parties for modifications or damage to the Work done without the City's authorization. However, the City may pursue claims against third parties for modifications or damage or to restore the Work if the work has been modified without the City's authorization. In the event that the City pursues such a claim, it shall notify the Artist, and Artist shall cooperate with the City's efforts to prosecute such claims.

If the City modifies the Artwork without the Artist's consent in a manner that is prejudicial to Artist's reputation, Artist retains the right to disclaim authorship of the Artwork in accordance with 17 U.S.C. § 106A (a) (2).

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Artist bears the sole responsibility for providing the City with any changes to the Artist's Address for Notice. Notice of changes must be mailed to the Dunwoody Arts Commission, 4800 Ashford Dunwoody Road, Dunwoody, Georgia 30346.

- for the purpose of installing, maintaining, operating and exhibiting the Artwork described in Exhibit B on and in the real property described in Exhibit A, including any building and structure thereon ("property"). The location of the Artwork shall be as approved by the Dunwoody Art Commission.
- 2. <u>Term of Easement</u>. This easement shall be for a period of ______ years from the date of execution. Unless terminated as provided in section 3, below, the easement shall automatically renew thereafter, and shall remain in full force and effect unless and until terminated.

3. <u>Termination</u>.

- a) At or after the expiration of the easement period, the easement may be terminated by either party upon 30 days written notice to the other party. Grantor expressly agrees and warrants that upon expiration, the Artwork shall be removed and the Property restored to its prior condition. Such removal shall occur within 30 days of the termination of the easement, unless this period is extended in writing by the City.
- b) Within the initial easement term (or at any time thereafter), the easement may be terminated by Grantor with the City's consent in writing upon Grantor's showing of any of the following: i) that the property is to be sold and the buyer requires removal of the easement as a condition of the purchase and sale; or ii) that the property is to be refinanced and the lender requires removal of the easement as a condition of the refinancing; or iii) that the property is to be substantially remodeled or altered in a way that precludes continued maintenance of the Artwork; or iv) that circumstances have materially changed and the continued existence of the easement or maintenance of the Artwork substantially impedes Grantor's reasonable use and enjoyment of the Property. The City shall not unreasonably withhold consent to termination upon Grantor's satisfactory demonstration of any of the foregoing conditions of termination.
- c) The City may terminate the easement at any time at its sole discretion upon 30 days written notice to Grantor, should Grantor fail to substantially perform Grantor's obligations under Section 4, below. Should the City elect to exercise this right of termination, Grantor expressly agrees and warrants that the Artwork shall be removed and the Property restored to its prior condition. Such removal shall occur within 30 days of the termination of the easement, unless this period is extended in writing by the City.
- 4. <u>Maintenance and Removal of Artwork</u>. Grantor shall be responsible for maintaining and if necessary, repairing the Artwork described in Exhibit B during the existence of the easement. The City may remove the Artwork from the

property if, in the sole judgment of the City, the Artwork is being excessively damaged, and Grantor fails or refuses to maintain or repair the Artwork after 30 days written notice from the City requesting Grantor to do so. If the City removes the Artwork from the property, the City will restore the property to its original condition. Alternatively, at the City's sole discretion, the City may access the Artwork to maintain or repair the Artwork if Grantor has failed to do so after 30 days written notice from the City that the Artwork requires maintenance or repair.

- 5. <u>Right of Entry.</u> The City shall have the right to access the area on the property described in Exhibit A on which the Artwork is located during normal business hours, and at all other times with advance approval of the Grantor, for any and all of the purposes described in this agreement.
- 6. <u>Binding Effect</u>. The easement granted in this agreement shall run with the land and be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Grantor and the City, and their respective successors or assigns, and any person or entity acquiring any right, title, or interest in the property.
- 7. <u>Contractual Relationships.</u> Assignment. This agreement does not constitute either party as the agent or legal representative of the other for any purpose whatsoever. The parties are not granted any express or implied right or authority to assume or create any obligation or responsibility on behalf of the other or to bind the other in any manner whatsoever. The parties shall not assign this agreement without the prior written consent of the other.
 - 8. <u>Notice</u>. Notice shall be made to the following addresses, unless otherwise provided for in writing:



- 9. <u>Amendments</u>. The parties expressly reserve the right to modify this agreement, from time to time, by mutual agreement. No modification or amendment of the provisions of this agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by authorized representatives of the parties.
- 10. Remedies. The parties acknowledge that breaches of this Agreement will affect substantial harm to the public interest which harm is difficult or impossible to prove as actual damages in an action hereunder. The parties agree that the prevailing party in an action for the breach of this agreement shall be entitled to a) liquidated damages in an amount of \$2500 per material breach; b) specific performance of the terms of this agreement, and each of them; c) reasonable attorney's fees; and d) any other remedies available at law or in equity. The rights under this agreement are cumulative. The failure to exercise on any occasion any right shall not operate to forfeit the right on another occasion. The use of one remedy shall not be taken to exclude or waive the right to use another.
- 11. <u>Invalidity of Particular Provisions</u>. Should any term, provision, condition or other portion of this agreement or the application thereof be held to be inoperative, invalid or unenforceable, the remainder of this agreement or the application of the term or provision to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid or unenforceable shall not be affected thereby and shall continue in full force and effect.
- 12. <u>No Waiver</u>. No waiver of full performance by any party shall be construed, or operate, as a waiver of any subsequent default or breach of any of the terms, covenants or conditions of this agreement.


UNDER THE CANOPY

Ashford Lane is garnering national attention as a case study for how an aging suburban shopping center can be remade as a community gathering place.

A new central green will replace an asphalt parking lot, a new food hall and offices will replace a vacant big box store, and pedestrian upgrades will link the property to its surroundings.

The Lawn, the property's new central green, is designed to serve as a "living room" for the community. The design will include shade trees, strung lights, and hanging flower pots, framed by a collection of restaurant patios. Programmed events and music will help create an informal town square.

"Under the Canopy" is a kaleidoscope-like interpretation of a lush English walled garden. The painted mural's design is both modern and familiar and creates an important backdrop to The Lawn. By repurposing old infrastructure, this large-scale installation will serve as another important step in Dunwoody's cultural evolution and the creation of a vibrant gathering place for families and nearby office workers.

 - (2) Directional elements such as super-graphics, signage or color coding except where these elements are integral parts of the original works of art;
 - (3) Mass-produced objects, such as fountains, statutory objects or playground equipment;
 - (4) Reproduction by mechanical or other means of original works of art;
 - (5) Decorative ornamental or functional elements created by the project architect or landscape architect instead of an artist commissioned for this purpose;
 - (6) Electrical, water or mechanical service for activation of the works of art;
 - (7) Art exhibitions and educational activities;
 - (8) Security and publicity concerning the works of art; and
 - (9) Art used as signage.
- (d) "Artist" shall be defined as an individual, or a group of people, who meets one or more of the following criteria:
 - (1) realizes income through the sale, performance, publication or commission of original works of art (2) has previously exhibited, presented, performed or published original works of art in museums, galleries or other recognized art venues and publications
 - (3) has formal training or education in a field of art; and
 - (4) has received awards or other forms of recognition from arts juries, arts grant panels, and similar entities for his/her/their artistic abilities or accomplishments.


Letter of Interest

I'm applying to the City of Dunwoody for the Women's History Month Murals. This project deeply resonates with me because Dunwoody is, and will always be, my home at heart. Many of my core childhood memories were at the Dunwoody Nature Center and Brook Run. Identifying as a tomboy and token weirdo at the time, I felt grounded when I was around the skating community. I would love to coalesce my personal experiences at the site location with the overarching theme of empowering women to create a heartfelt and unique piece of art.

For my mural, I feel called to dive deeper into the topic of mentorship between women, especially when their passions align with activities that are predominantly male-dominated, such as skating. I was especially thrilled to see the girls-only skateboarding contest that took place at Brook Run this past April, and want to keep that momentum to allow women (both young and old) to feel welcome and confident. Because many of the viewers will be driving when they see the mural, I want to create a piece that's both visually interesting from afar and up close, as well as incorporate an interactive element for the younger audience to interface with.

I successfully created a mural for last year's Women's History Month project, and have been a working artist for over 10 years. I've also worked as an art tutor for four years now, and consistently work with people on their own confidence to step out of their comfort zone and take action, regardless if there are people who have more painting or drawing experience. This is one of the reasons why I would love to make the mural interactive. Thank you so much for taking the time to review this application, and I hope my fervor for this project has made a positive impact on you so I can expand and make a positive impact on the community as well!

Rough Digital Draft



For this piece, I want to shift gears and illustrate with a playful, comic style. The skateboards facing the front will be painted using chalkboard paint, and the chalk box will be attached to the bottom right of the mural. Several colors of chalk will be included with delivery of mural! The rest will be painted using spray paints and acrylics.

Stylistically, the font is meant to be clear and readable from a distance, for any onlookers just driving by. Think, "Everything Will Be Okay" but revamped! The palette is specifically taken from "vapor wave" art, which is an aesthetic originally characterized by glitch art and 80's/90's subculture. Visually, it reads as an intimate and nostalgic moment taking place at dusk, and is meant to encapsulate the feeling of skating all day until the sun sets.

The two characters are meant to have an ambiguous relationship. Could it be a mother and daughter? Perhaps a cousin, or an older mentor? These moments are oftentimes how deeper friendships are kindled at the skatepark. My hope is that some friendships may even form while people are drawing on the skateboards! As a young artist, public collaboration, even in its most playful form, was one of my favorite things to do. Would perhaps put "DRAW HERE!" on the skateboard in chalk before placing mural, or have another indication to the side of the piece.




Women's History Month Mural for Brook Run 2020









Sapphire Garden, 2020, oil on wood, 24" x 24"








AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DUNWOODY CREATING PROCEDURES FOR ESTABLISHMENT OF PUBLIC ART INSTALLATIONS AND IMPLEMENTATION OF PUBLIC ART PROGRAM

Chapter 29. Public Art.

Sec. 29-1. Definitions.

- (a) "Public Art" shall be defined as a work created by an artist as defined herein, as approved by the Public Art Commission created herein, for display in public space or visible from a public space.
- (b) Public Art shall include the following:
 - (1) All forms of limited edition or one-of-a-kind original creations of visual art, both decorative and utilitarian, including but not limited to paintings, drawings, photographs, collages, ceramics, artistic glass, stained glass, and fiber art
 - (2) Functional features or enhancements, such as benches and fountains, that are unique to the location
 - (3) Murals, frescos or mosaics covering walls
 - (4) Sculptures, including statues, reliefs and mobiles, which can be free-standing, wall-supported and/or suspended and made of durable materials suitable to the site and the climate; and
 - (5) Technological media that may develop through artistic pursuit or adaptation of digital, audio, video or graphic media; use of lighting, the internet, and the like;
 - (6) Other suitable artworks as presented to, and approved by, the sole decision of the Public Art Commission.
- (c) Public Art shall not include:
 - (1) Elements incorporated for the primary purpose of advertising a business, product or service, including but not limited to logos, trademarked symbols, colors, images of commercial products, texts or numbers;
 - (2) Directional elements such as super-graphics, signage or color coding except where these elements are integral parts of the original works of art;
 - (3) Mass-produced objects, such as fountains, statutory objects or playground equipment;
 - (4) Reproduction by mechanical or other means of original works of art;
 - (5) Decorative ornamental or functional elements created by the project architect or landscape architect instead of an artist commissioned for this purpose;
 - (6) Electrical, water or mechanical service for activation of the works of art;
 - (7) Art exhibitions and educational activities;
 - (8) Security and publicity concerning the works of art; and
 - (9) Art used as signage.
- (d) "Artist" shall be defined as an individual, or a group of people, who meets one or more of the following criteria:
 - (1) realizes income through the sale, performance, publication or commission of original works of art (2) has previously exhibited, presented, performed or published original works of art in museums, galleries or other recognized art venues and publications
 - (3) has formal training or education in a field of art; and
 - (4) has received awards or other forms of recognition from arts juries, arts grant panels, and similar entities for his/her/their artistic abilities or accomplishments.
