Subject: Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Implementation Grant Application

ACTION

Authorize the Mayor, City Manager, or designee to execute all documents necessary and proper to apply for a Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) federal grant to implement safety and multi-modal improvements along North Peachtree Road between I-285 and Brook Run Park.

SUMMARY

The City of Dunwoody is eligible to apply for federal funds through the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program to implement recommendations from the Dunwoody Road Safety Action Plan, which was adopted in November 2023. City staff is in the process of preparing an SS4A Implementation Grant application to fund design and construction activities for a project that would address safety and multi-modal connectivity along North Peachtree Road between I-285 and Tilly Mill Road.

The total estimated cost for the project is \$19,750,000.00, including preliminary engineering, right-of-way, utilities, and construction costs. Of that amount, the requested federal share (80%) would be \$15,800,000, while the matching City share (20%) would be \$3,950,000.00. The city budget currently includes approximately \$750,000 designated for roadway safety projects. If the city is successful in obtaining the SS4A grant, some projects in the current 5-year capital budget may need to be deferred to free up funding for the remainder of the local match requirement.

Certain forms required for the grant application require signature by an official authorized to sign on behalf of the City. The application deadline is May 16, 2024.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

Authorize the Mayor, City Manager, or designee to execute all documents necessary and proper to apply for a Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) federal grant to implement safety and multi-modal improvements along North Peachtree Road between I-285 and Brook Run Park.
