- **WHEREAS,** according to the National Kidney Foundation, about 100,000 people are waiting for a kidney transplant at any given time; and
- **WHEREAS,** longtime Dunwoody resident Amy Parker Zupancic and her sons Daniel and Caleb have each served as altruistic and life-saving kidney donors, giving a kidney to someone they didn't know; and
- **WHEREAS,** the Zupancic family's generous and selfless acts serve as an inspiration to others; and

NOW, THEREFORE I, Lynn Deutsch, Mayor of Dunwoody, do hereby proclaim March 2023 as Kidney Health Month in order to raise awareness and encourage others to consider becoming a life-saving donor.
