Highlights:



 Ribbon cutting was held at the Brook Run Park playground on October 15th for the first non-verbal communication board. Our Sponsor has been identified, and



- production has begun for the second board, which will be installed at Two Bridges Park.
- Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the 2026 Black History Month mural exhibit closed October 31st. Submissions will be presented to the Dunwoody Arts Commission at the December 2nd meeting. RFQ for 2026 Women's History Month mural exhibit opened November 3.

- Dunwoody Preservation Trust held their 7th annual Farm to Table Dinner and Silent Auction event on October 4th, for a near-sold-out event of 72 guests.
 Volunteers managed and ran this event, including 25 students from the Dunwoody High School Honor Society.

POLICE

Highlights, Accolades and Happenings:

- October 9, 2025, Dunwoody Police Department (DPD) hosted Pizza with Police for Faith & Blue Weekend at Brook Run Park.
- October 21, 2025, DPD hosted a Coffee with a Cop event in celebration of Faith & Blue at Marcus Jewish Community Center.
- October 24, 2025, DPD partnered with Target to host a free Child Safety Seat Check event.
- October 25, 2025, DPD hosted a tour for the Dunwoody Area Chapter of Jack and Jill of America. Kids learned how the department uses technology to keep the community safe.
- October 30, 2025, DPD distributed free safety flashers to kids at Dunwoody's Truck or Treat event held at Brook Run Park. This is called the department's See & Be Seen safety campaign.
- October 30-31, 2025, officers visited Kingsley Elementary to meet with K-5th grade students to talk about Halloween safety tips.
- DPD's Holiday Food Drive (non-perishables) is going on now through November 18, 2025. Drop Off bins are located around the city including the Police Dept,



CrossFit Dunwoody, Club Pilates, The Joint, Workout Anytime and Chupito's Azteca Grille.

Workload/Activities (highlights):

- Shoplifting/Firearms/Missing Person 130 Perimeter Ctr W: Officers responded to a shoplifting in progress involving three black males. Sandy Springs officers had the suspect vehicle surrounded upon arrival. One suspect, identified as a juvenile, was detained and found to be reported missing out of DeKalb County. Search incident to arrest revealed marijuana, a scale, ski mask, and charging block. Vehicle search yielded three firearms (PA-13 Multi, Glock 22, and Glock 19), a 60-round magazine, additional marijuana, scales, and identification cards for other individuals. The suspect concealed ammunition in his jacket before exiting the store with two other unidentified males. The juvenile suspect was transported to the Regional Youth Detention Center without incident.
- Aggravated Assault/Person shot/Attempted Auto Theft The Columns at Lake Ridge: Officers responded to a person shot call. The victim was in his apartment when he noticed the lights of his Infinity come on. He went to the front door and looked outside to see what was going on. A few seconds after pointing his head out of the door he was shot at by unknown subjects who were attempting to steal his car using a OBD II key defeating device. One of the rounds hit the doorframe of his apartment directly in front of the man's chest. The door frame stopped the bullet but shrapnel still struck his chest causing superficial wounds. He was treated on scene by AMR. Video was collected from several neighbors. CID and CSI were notified and responded to the scene.
- Flock Hit/Wanted Person Located Mt. Vernon Road/Chamblee Dunwoody Road: Officers and the Real Time Crime Center responded to a Flock hit for a black 2021 Cadillac Escalade. The registered owner had an active DeKalb County warrant for aggravated assault. The vehicle was followed into the parking lot of Dunwoody United Methodist Church where the suspect was detained and arrested. There was initial confusion with the suspect's brother who also had an active warrant and had previously used the suspect's identifying information. The warrant was confirmed and the suspect was transported to DeKalb Jail.
- Person Hit by Auto with Injury /DUI Ashford Dunwoody Road and Hammond Drive: A male was crossing Ashford Dunwoody Rd in the crosswalk at Hammond Dr. and was struck by vehicle that continued southbound without stopping. The victim sustained head injuries but was alert and conscious while officers were rendering aid and a short time later the vehicle returned to the scene and the driver made himself known to officers. During this contact the officer noted signs



of intoxication and the driver submitted to roadsides and was arrested. The victim was transported to Grady with non-life-threatening injuries. The vehicle (Telsa) was towed with a hold being placed on the vehicle. The driver was transported to Dekalb Jail and released into their custody.

Kellogg Springs Drive Stream Stabilization project completed.




Construction began for the Old Spring House Path.



COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Highlights:

 The Direction Dunwoody Steering Committee has started work on the Unified Development Ordinance. The Unified Development Ordinance will codify the much-needed changes to the old code and implement the land use policy direction of the recently adopted Comprehensive Plan.

Upcoming Events:

- The City Council will conduct a second read for a master sign plan for the Campus 244 development as well as for a rezoning for a veterinary hospital on North Shallowford Road during its November 10 meeting.
- At the November 10 meeting, the City Council will conduct first reads for two new restaurants: SLUP applications for a proposed Raising Canes restaurant on Ashford Dunwoody Road and for a proposed Portillo's restaurant on Perimeter Center East.

Accolades and Happenings:

- The Planning Commission recommended approval of a SLUP for a drive-through Zaxby's restaurant at Perimeter Center West. The City Council will hear the case in December.
- The Community Development Department participated in a research project by a Johns Hopkins University graduate student on opportunities for greenhouse gas emission reductions.

The Building Division has completed 458 inspections.



- The Living Spaces furniture store construction on Ravinia Parkway is continuing.
- The Code Enforcement division conducted 58 inspections including 7 vacant properties, received 56 new complaints and brought 22 cases into compliance.
- The Code Enforcement division removed 97 signs from the right-of-way.
- The staff issued 36 code enforcement warnings and 0 citations.
- The department conducted 89 erosion control inspections, issued 0 notices of violation, and 0 stop work orders.

FINANCE

- The FY2026 Mayor and City Manager's Proposed Operating and Capital Budget was approved at the October 27th Council meeting.
- Third Quarter ARPA report was submitted to the US Treasury Department by October 31st deadline.
- The August 2025 Monthly Financial Update was published to the Finance webpage, as well as the updates to the CARES and ARPA webpages.

MUNICIPAL COURT

Workload/Activities:
