PARKS

Highlights:

- New program: STEM Camp by Dunwoody Coding School will be held at Windwood Hollow Park, Monday-Friday in June and July.
- 3rd Annual Special Olympics bocce tournament was held at Georgetown Park on April 23.
- Two Bridges Park splash pad and Brook Run Park playground stream are both on for the season.

Accolades and Happenings:

- Ribbon cutting of the new Common Ground sculpture was held at Georgetown Park on April 14.
- Parks led the Dunwoody Woman's Club through a tour of the new boardwalk at Dunwoody Nature Center and provided updates for the department.

- Operations team supported Black April, Lemonade Days, and Dunwoody Community Garden and Orchard plant sale events with tables, tents, and barricades.
- Dunwoody Cultural Arts Center mural near the Stage Door Theater entrance will be presented to the Dunwoody Arts Commission on May 5.
- Punch Walk for the new Brook Run Park maintenance shop is scheduled for May 4.
- Trip hazard work at Brook Run Park is scheduled for May 11-22 to address the sidewalks along the main park drive and front field.
- Meetings with GIS and IT to discuss department needs for maps, dashboards, data storytelling, and more.
- Construction Management At-Risk solicitation for Homecoming Park is open until May 11. Two firms attended the pre-qualification meeting on April 27.
- Tennis court resurfacing at Windwood Hollow Park is scheduled for the week of May 11.

- City Staff and Contractors completed 29 citizen and internally generated work orders.

- Dunwoody Nature Center turned 58 pounds of waste into 19 pounds of compost. Since the start of the composting program, members have created 2,487 pounds of compost and they've shared 268 pounds with local gardens.
- Spruill Center for the Arts 2025 Impact Report was released, highlighting nearly 10,500 people enrolled in camps and classes, 447 scholarships awarded to adults & children, and 195 visits to the Free Art Closet, which distributed over \$5,000 of free art supplies. [Read the full report here.](#)

POLICE

Highlights, Accolades and Happenings:

- Peer Support Counselors Det. Haviland, Ofc. Hernandez and PSAC K9 Savannah were recognized by DeKalb Police Dept. on April 8, 2026 for their compassionate support following the loss of two DeKalb officers in 2025.
- DPD Bailiff and Citizen on Patrol Volunteers were recognized at the April 13, 2026 Council meeting for their 1,767 hours of (collective) service to the City in 2025.
- April 18, 2026, PSAC K9 Savannah participated in the University of North Georgia Memorial 5K Run, along with several other law enforcement agencies to honor the life and sacrifice of two UNG graduates who lost their lives in the line of duty.
- April 19, 2026, DPD hosted Girl Scout Troop 25080 at Headquarters, where they were offered a tour of the department and RTCC center as well as an opportunity to meet K9 Zorro.
- April 25, 2026, 10:00am-2:00pm, DPD hosted a DEA National Drug Take Back Day. A total of 192 lbs. of unwanted and expired prescription medications were collected and destroyed.

Workload/Activities (highlights):

- Burglary – 10 Peachford Cir: Officers responded to an audible alarm at the maintenance shed at the listed location. Upon arriving on scene, the doors to the

maintenance shed were found unsecure with fresh damage caused by a pry tool. During a Flock search a black Dodge Durango with a temp tag was located in the area of N Shallowford Rd at Cotillion Dr traveling south. A BOLO was provided to surrounding agencies in reference to the Durango and the burglary. At 0450 Brookhaven responded to a maintenance shed burglary in their jurisdiction near Clairmont Rd and located the Dodge Durango. Brookhaven was involved in a short vehicle pursuit with the Durango however the pursuit was terminated.

- Recovered Stolen Vehicle/Flock hit – 4313 Dunwoody Gables Dr: An officer was checking the area of Meadow Lane Rd in reference to a Flock hit from earlier in the afternoon regarding a stolen red Honda Accord. While checking the area of Dunwoody Gables Drive, the officer located the vehicle parked in a parking spot by the listed address. While confirming the vehicle through GCIC a female met with the officer at the vehicle and explained that she had permission to drive the vehicle. Through the investigation it was learned that the female's boyfriend had reported the vehicle stolen in Atlanta because he was angry at the female at the time he had filed the report.
- Aggravated Assault w/Firearm – 100 Perimeter Lofts Cir: Officers responded to the listed location in reference to a discharging firearm's call for service. Upon arriving on scene, the victims stated that a female in the parking deck started yelling at them asking if they lived there and why were they there. After a brief verbal argument, the victims pulled in front of the vehicle that the female that was yelling at them was seen sitting in. a short moment later two males appeared from the west side of the parking deck and yelled at the two victims. The victims stated that the next thing they remembered was the males were shooting at them. A bullet hole was located on the hood of the victim's vehicle, which exited the hood and hit the lower section of the windshield on the driver's side. Another bullet hole was located in the rear bumper of a parked (unoccupied) Kia sedan. Through the investigation officers were able to locate the apartment that the two male shooters were hiding in, as well as the female that had started the verbal altercation with the victims.
- Shoplifting/Use of Force - 120 Perimeter Ctr W (Ulta): Officers were dispatched to the location in reference to a shoplifting in progress with a suspect was walking away from Ulta toward the mall. Real Time Crime Center cameras found the suspect walking through the parking lot of Von Maur where an officer located her and made contact. Immediately upon the officer's attempt to detain the offender, she began to resist arrest by pulling away and trying to run. The officer deployed his taser, but did not obtain Neuromuscular Incapacitation (NMI). The offender wriggled away and began to run. The officer deployed OC spray, but the offender continued to run. She made her way across the street to Velvet Taco and locked herself in the women's bathroom. After several requests for her to exit, she eventually cracked the door to communicate but upon seeing officers, she quickly closed and locked the door again. With further negotiation, she cracked open the door again and officers were able to push their way into the bathroom where the offender continued to resist arrest, but was ultimately taken into custody. AMR arrived to provide medical care and cleared her on scene. The offender was medically cleared at Northside and transported to jail by night shift without issue.

Highlights:

- Brook Run Maintenance Facility- Construction completed. Move-in scheduled for May.

- Hosted an invasive plant removal event at Two Bridges Park with volunteers from the Southeast Stormwater Association. Over 10 dump truck loads of invasive species were removed.

- Mount Vernon Path Phase 2- right-of-way acquisition is ongoing.
- Ashford Dunwoody Path Phase 2- right-of-way acquisition is ongoing for 5 parcels south of Meadow Lane Road.
- City maintenance crews completed 30 stormwater, asphalt and concrete work orders this month.
- Processed 38 utility permits in March including 23 from Google Fiber. Google began installing fiber in Dunwoody Station and The Branches.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Highlights:

- The City Council has declared the annual Sustainability Hero awards during the April 27, 2026 City Council meeting. Trophies were presented to the Dunwoody United Methodist Church and to Malte Weiland.

Upcoming Events:

Accolades and Happenings:

- The Household Electronics Recycling Event was a success. 467 residents dropped off 24,025 pounds of electronics for recycling.
- Providence Group has submitted a rezoning application for three residential lots behind North Atlanta Church of Christ. The units are part of a larger subdivision that is mostly located in Sandy Springs and can only be accessed through Spalding Drive.
- Work at the Living Spaces store at Ashford Dunwoody Road and Ravinia Parkway and the interior buildout for TriNet at High Street are progressing well. Both are in the framing and rough-in stage.
