



City Manager's Monthly Report

June 2026

PARKS

Highlights:

- Brook Run Park multi-use fields will be receiving a muraled kick wall and soccer ball themed bike racks by mid-July.

Accolades and Happenings:

- In the coming months, each Dunwoody park will be highlighted on social media through a new "introducing" video series. The series focuses on introducing lesser-known public parks to the community, while highlighting new and future improvements. Vernon Oaks Park and Windwood Hollow Park are complete.

Department Items:

- Solar panel installation at the Dunwoody Cultural Arts Center and N. Shallowford Annex are scheduled to begin mid-August.
- Informal Written Quote (IWQ) for the Brook Run Park greenhouse opens July 2, seeking professional planning and concept design services for renovating/rebuilding the current structure. A mandatory site visit with Parks staff and the Dunwoody Community Garden and Orchard board is scheduled for July 20.
- Staff is progressing through the schematic design phase of Homecoming Park. Kick-off meeting with Construction Manager At-Risk and design team scheduled for late July.

- June 8, 2026, a **promotional ceremony** took place inside Dunwoody Hall to recognize newly promoted Major A. Fondas, Lieutenant H. Nelson and Sergeant P. Greene.
- June 14, 2026, Community Outreach Officer Hernandez represented Georgia in the final leg of the **Law Enforcement Torch Run** leading up to the 2026 Special Olympics US Games that took place in Minnesota.
- Lieutenant J. Dove was recognized at the June 15, 2026 Council Meeting for being our most recent staff graduate from **Northwestern School of Police Staff and Command**.

Workload/Activities (highlights):

- **Remote Camera hit/Drone as First Responder (DFR) assist:** Officers were notified of a black Toyota Camry with the registered owner wanted for a DPD failure to appear. Vehicle entered the mall near Dillard’s on Perimeter Center West. Officers launched the drone and quickly located the vehicle at the Hammond Dr exit near Chick-fil-A after a remote camera update from the Real Time Crime Center (RTCC). The drone followed the vehicle until it parked in a spot in front of Newk’s Eatery. An officer arrived as the driver was exiting and detained her without issue.
- **Agency Assist/Use Of Force - 1889 9th St:** Kilo 1 and Kilo 4 assisted Chamblee PD in locating a suspect who fled on foot into a residential neighborhood following theft and obstruction charges. With assistance from the Brookhaven PD, the suspect was located hiding underneath a porch at a residence in Brookhaven. While issuing verbal commands for the suspect to exit from beneath the residence, Kilo 4 displayed his

department-issued firearm due to the unknown risk factors associated with the suspect and the possibility that he was armed. The suspect complied with commands and was taken into custody without incident. During a search incident to arrest, officers recovered an empty firearm holster from the suspect's person. A loaded handgun was later located underneath the porch where the suspect had been hiding. Further investigation revealed that the suspect had an active armed robbery warrant out of DeKalb County. UOF report has been completed.

- **Wanted Person Located/Remote Camera Hit – 136 Perimeter Ctr W/TJ Maxx:** Officers responded to the area of TJ Maxx after a black Acura Integra hit off the remote camera near that location in reference to a wanted person. The Acura was located in the parking lot of the TJ Maxx unoccupied. Officers set up on the vehicle and made contact with the offender when he returned to his vehicle. The offender was detained and the warrant was confirmed.
- **Missing Person Located – Perimeter Ctr Pkwy/Hammond Dr:** The reporting party, stated that his 90-year-old father had dropped him off at the Dunwoody MARTA station. The reporting party believed that his father, who has Alzheimer's, would be able to drive home safely to his address off Village Springs Place. Unfortunately, the victim became confused driving and did not drive straight home, instead found his way driving around the City of Roswell. Roswell PD was made aware of the victim's condition and through the use of remote cameras he was safely located in less than an hour at a gas station by Roswell PD.

PUBLIC WORKS

Highlights:

- The Georgia Department of Transportation awarded a \$1,060,000 grant to design improvements on Chamblee Dunwoody Road from Peeler Road to Vermack Road.
- Ridgeview Road Sidewalk- Atlanta Gas Light completed the gas main relocation. Comcast completed their relocation. Contractor began site grading.

Upcoming Events:

- Mount Vernon Path Phase 3 from Dunwoody Village to Vermack online public comment period is scheduled to begin in late July.

Department Items:

- Old Spring House Path- Completion of the final segments of path have been delayed pending Comcast moving overhead lines to new poles which was completed on July 3rd. AT&T has one line to remove, and final path completion is expected in August.
- Uneven sidewalk was repaired at 305 locations on 8 roads scheduled for paving in 2026.
- Stormwater rehabilitation projects completed on Hidden Branches Court, Layfield Court, Arrie Way, Davantry Drive and Lakeside Drive.
- Ashford Dunwoody Path Phase 2- right-of-way acquisition is 55% complete for the west side of Ashford Dunwoody Road between Perimeter Center West and Meadow Lane Road.
- Happy Hollow Road Sidewalk-right-of-way and easement acquisition is ongoing.
- Peeler Road Path- right-of-way and easement acquisition is ongoing.
- Mount Vernon Path Phase 2- right-of-way and easement acquisition is ongoing.
- City maintenance crews completed 50 stormwater, asphalt and concrete work orders this month.
- Processed 34 utility permits in June. Google Fiber is currently working in The Branches and Valley View neighborhoods and along Mount Vernon Road, Chamblee Dunwoody Road and Roberts Drive.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Highlights:

- The Department has started the DRI (Development of Regional Impact) process for the second phase of the Campus 244 process. In the next few months, the Atlanta Regional Commission and the Georgia Transportation Efficiency Authority will review the project for transportation and planning impacts.

Upcoming and Recent Events:

- The City Council will conduct a public hearing for a rezoning, special land use permit, and master sign plan for a new Kroger store in the old Walmart space at Perimeter Village during its July 13, 2026 meeting. The store will include a gas station and a pharmacy drive-through.
- Ashton Woods is presenting their plan for 122 townhomes on 1200 Ashwood Parkway on July 14 planning commission. The townhomes will replace the current 5 story office building.
- The City Council will discuss the Georgetown Small Area Plan during its July 27, 2026 meeting. The small area plan was developed with community input to propose a future development vision for the Georgetown area.
- Lennar Homes will be presenting a 33 townhomes development on 4891 Ashford Dunwoody Road on August 11 for the planning commission.
- High Street is presenting their amendment to one of their blocks from mixed use to office and retail on August 11 for the planning commission.

Accolades and Happenings:

- The City Council and the Sustainability Committee held a joint meeting on June 3, 2026 to coordinate efforts on upcoming sustainability efforts.
- Construction of the new Living Spaces furniture store at 11 Ravinia Parkway is continuing with the steel frame being completed.
- The City Council heard a proposed text amendment to shorten review periods for zoning cases during its June 15, 2026 meeting. The second read will take place on July 13, 2026.

Data:

- The Department received 140 permit applications in June and has issued 113 permits.
- The valuation of all permits issued in June 2026 was \$4.1M.
- The Building Division has completed 400 inspections.
- The Code Enforcement division conducted 61 initial inspections including 7 vacant properties, received 67 new complaints and brought 26 cases into compliance.
- The Code Enforcement division removed 125 signs from the right-of-way.
- The staff issued 48 code enforcement warnings and 1 citation.
- The Department conducted 242 erosion control inspections and 1 stop work order.

- 2026 Millage Rate Public Hearings were held at City Hall on Monday, June 15 at 8am and 6pm, and on Wednesday, July 1 at 6pm.
- The FY 2027 Operating and Capital budget process was started, with the deadline for departments to submit their FY2027 budget requests to Finance by July 31, 2026,
- Finance staff, in conjunction with Municipal Court staff, continue to work on the internal audit of Tyler payments for Court.
- April 2026 Monthly Financial Update Report was published to the Finance webpage. Additionally, the ARPA and CARES webpages were updated with activity through May 31, 2026.
